Key Results from 2010-11 School Improvement Plans

Improvement plans, which outline current and ongoing school goals, are developed by each Fulton County school. These guide school administrators and teachers toward improving student achievement and overall school success.

Objective - Improve student performance in Math

Results - Overall students in 3-5 grades exceeded the target/indicator of success with a score of 88%. This exceeded our target by 4%. Our ELL students exceeded the target with a score of 81%. Students with Disabilities did not achieve the target, however, they did have an increase of 10% from the previous year thereby meeting AYP goals.

Objective - Improve student performance in Reading/English Language Arts

Results - Overall students in 3-5 grades exceeded the target/indicator of success with a score of 90%. This exceeded our target by 4%. Our ELL students exceeded the target with a score of 76%. Our students with Disabilities did not meet the target resulting in this subgroup of students not meeting AYP.

Overall our students met AYP goals in 16/17 reporting categories.

At Manning Oaks all grade levels collaborate weekly on instruction and student engagement. Teachers analyze data and adjust instruction to meet the needs of all students. Parent and business partners volunteer to support learning in Reading and Math.

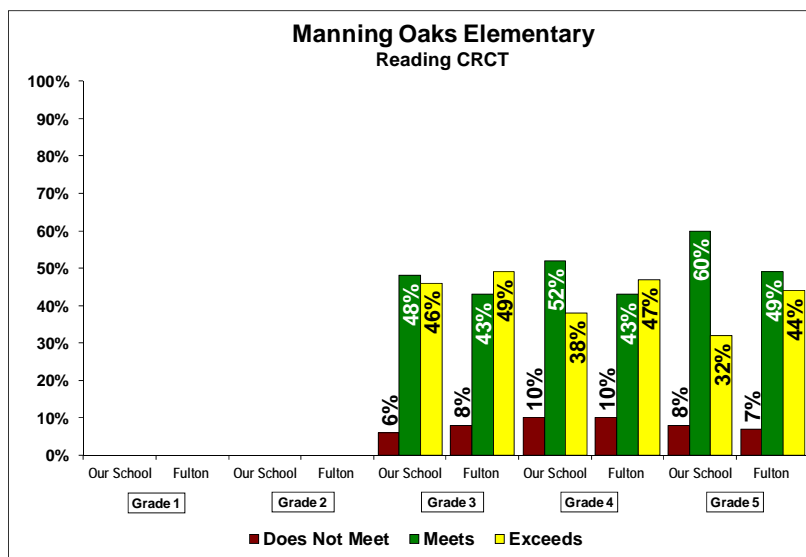
2010-11 Academic Achievement Georgia Criterion-Referenced Competency Tests

The Georgia Criterion-Referenced Competency Tests (CRCT) are given in grades one through eight. The test measures specific skills included in the Georgia core curriculum that are considered essential for continued academic progress.

CRCT scores are reported as levels. Level I indicates students do not yet meet expectations. Students scoring at Level 2 meet the state's expectations of being on grade level, and students at Level 3 exceed expectations, or are above grade level. Scores are reported by the percent of students in a school scoring at or above grade level.

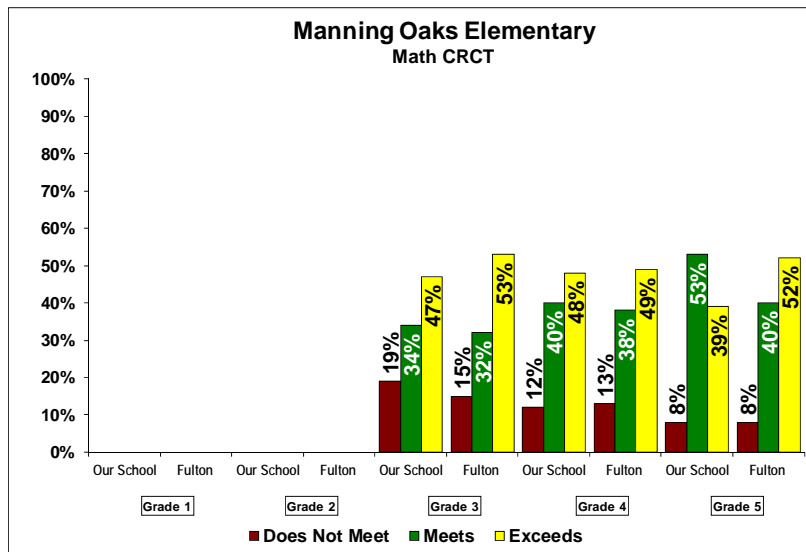
Reading Achievement –

Fulton County Averages



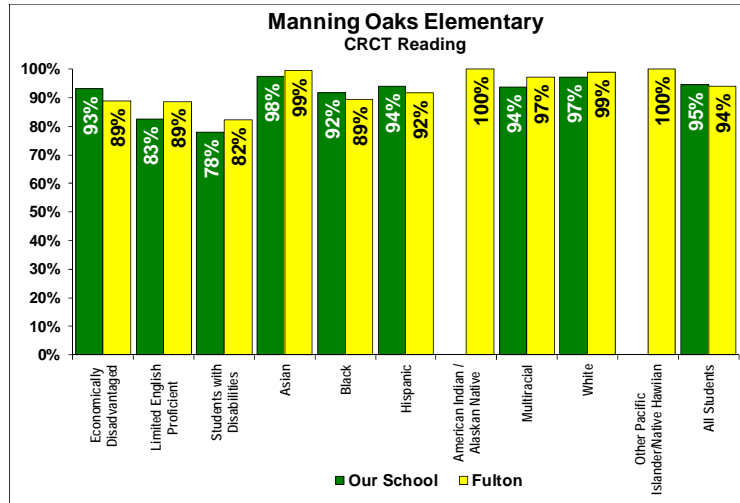
Math Achievement –

Fulton County Averages



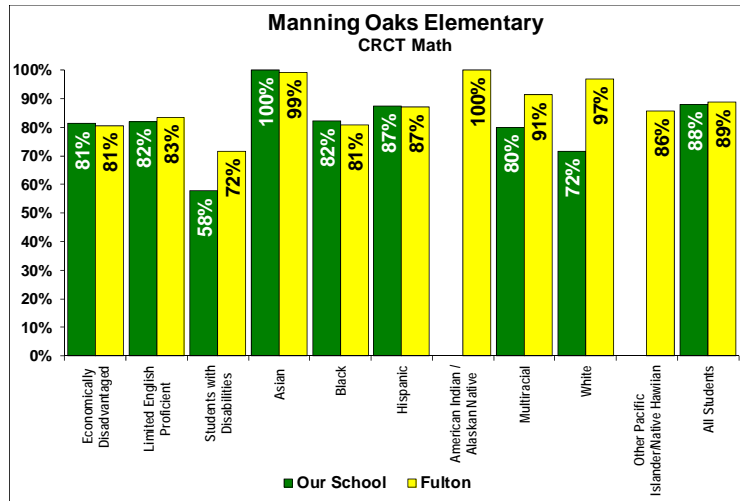
**Reading Achievement –

Student Demographics**

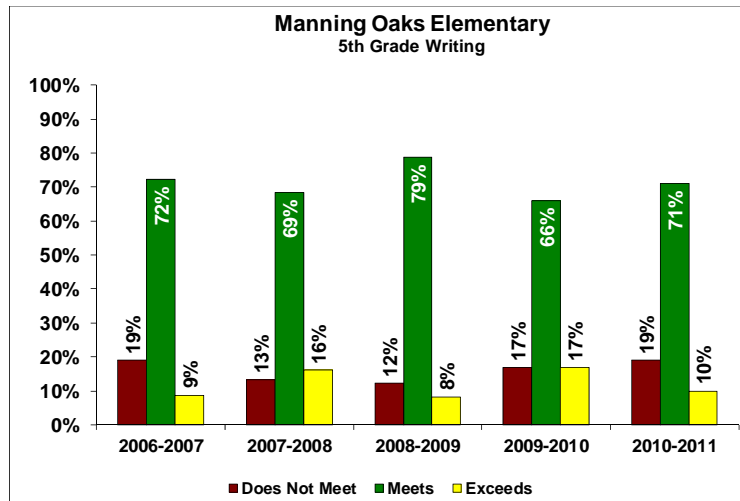

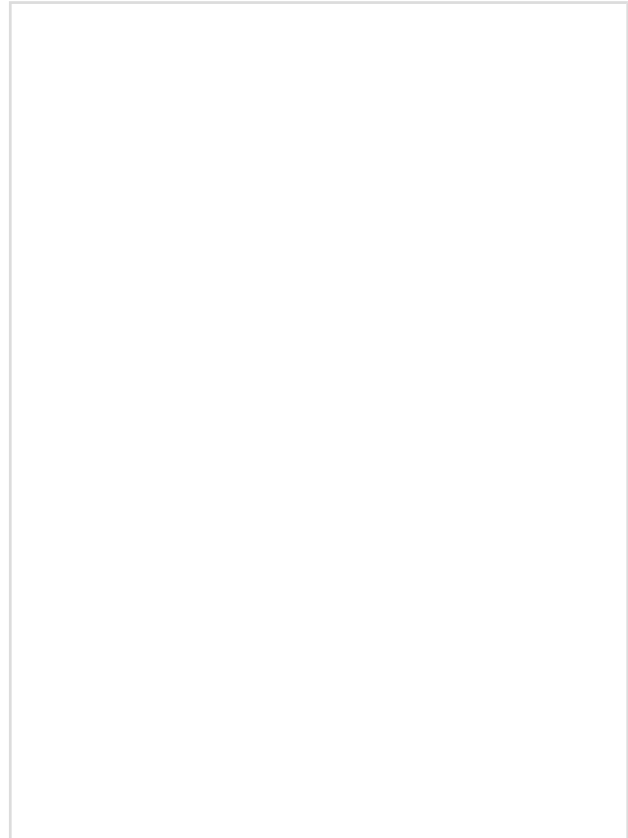
